
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MISSION OF IWISE

HOW IWISE WORKS

There are two rounds for iWISE:
The Virtual Finals (Preliminary Round).
The Global Final (Final Round).



The Virtual Final to participate in this round, students simply need to make an online submission via our website, in addition to making your submission you will need to book a zoom appointment to present your ARTWORK/TALENT PERFORMANCE/STEM PROJECT to our judges. Our expert judges will evaluate the student's work and select the best and brightest to move on to the iWISE Global Final. All medalists from the Virtual Finals will directly qualify for the iWISE Global Final. All gold medalists will achieve a 10% discount to register for the iWISE Global Final.

For those who don't qualify, our judges will provide valuable feedback to help them improve their submission and prepare for the next Virtual Final. At iWISE, we believe in the potential of every student, and we are committed to providing a supportive and inclusive environment for all participants.

All medalists from the Virtual Finals will directly qualify for the iWISE Global Final.

All gold medalists will achieve a 10% discount to register for the iWISE Global Final. A confirmation letter acknowledging their qualification will be provided exclusively to those who meet the criteria set for the Global Final. The duration for the iWISE Global Final is 6 days including arrival and departure days.



AWARDS / PRIZES FOR IWISE GLOBAL FINAL

All participants will receive an iWISE certificate of participation. Participants that perform exceptionally, will receive an iWISE certificate of achievement and a medal. The Top 3 achievers in the main categories (Art / Talent/ STEM) will qualify for grand cash prizes as follows:

£600 for first position/top position

£450 for second position

£300 for third position.

Special Awards:

Best Performing School Award:

The Best Performing School Award will be given to the school which has the highest points from their student's achievements: each gold medal will count as 5 points, each silver medal counts as 3 points, each bronze medal counts as 2 points and each honorable mention certificate counts as 1 point.

Most Amount of Applicants School Award:

The Most Amount of Applicants School Award will be awarded to the school that made the most amount of submissions to the iWISE Global Round. Each school will have 1 point per submission, 3 points per applicant and 5 points per educator.

iWISE Olympiad Ambassador Award:

The iWISE Olympiad's Ambassador Award will be given to the educator/teacher who registers the most number of applicants to the Global Final.

The Most Successful Ambassador Award:

The Most Successful Ambassador Award will be given to the educator/supervisor whose students perform exceptionally at Global Final. Each educator /supervisor will get 5 points for per gold medal, 3 points per silver medals, 2 points per bronze medal and 1 point per honorable mention.

Gold Medal	10% of participants

JUDGING PRINCIPALS FOR ART CATEGORY

Judging will be done at the discretion of the iWISE Olympiad. All artwork will be judged by a panel selected by the iWISE Olympiad Organization. The Judges will score each criterion on a scale of 0-5, with zero being the lowest and 5 being the highest rank.

Judgment will be based on how the relevant theme is addressed within the presentation, creativity of the art piece, the level of complexity within the art piece, the focal point of the presentation, the design of the artwork, harmony of colors, compelling competition, display of emotion, presentation of participants, verbal message of the poster, subject matter, storytelling etc.

JUDGING PRINCIPALS FOR TALENT CATEGORY

Judging will be done at the discretion of the iWISE Olympiad. All artwork will be judged by a panel selected by the iWISE Olympiad Organization. The Judges will score each criterion on a scale of 0-5, with zero being the lowest and 5 being the highest rank.

Judging Principles for Short Film Category:

Short films will be judged on its originality, creativity, plot, structure, characters, cinematography, entertainment value as well as the effectiveness of the message being portrayed and the ability of the filmmaker to reach an audience. When creating a film that carries a message, it is important that you have the ability and knowledge of how to get your message to your audience so that your film can gather public support and awareness.

Judging Principles for Short Animated film Category:

Short Animated films will be judged on originality, creativity, engagement, editing, audio, music, sound effects, storytelling, characters, cinematography, entertainment value as well as the effectiveness of the message and the ability of the filmmaker to reach an audience. When creating a film that carries a message, it is important that you have the ability and knowledge of how to get your message to your audience so that your film can gather public support and awareness.



Judging Principles for Graphic Design Category

Graphic Design will be judged on the originality of expression, relation of the design to the relevant theme, creativity of the design, technical execution, visual language, originality, personal vision, effort and level of complexity etc.

Judging Principles for Music & Dance Categories

Judges will look for creative-dynamics, intonation, tone quality, effectiveness of presentation, performance, foundation, relevance, audience impact, knowledge of choreography, stage presence, effort, technique, etc.

Judging Principles for Creative Writing (Poetry, Short Essay & Short Story) Category

Judges will look for entries in each age category which illustrates one or more of the following: Clarity and originality of expression, creativity, artistic quality and relevance to the theme, significance and originality of thought, characters; presentation and development, structure, organization, convention etc. The judge will consider the extent to which the writing exhibits effective control of tone, diction, parallelism, balance, inversion, sentence length and also how the entry effectively demonstrates a developed, focused and concluded discussion of ideas and an establishment and maintenance of a controlling idea.



JUDGING PRINCIPALS FOR STEM CATEGORIES

Judging will be done at the discretion of the iWISE Olympiad. All projects will be judged by a panel selected by the iWISE Olympiad Organization. Judges score each criterion on a scale of 0-3, with zero being the lowest and 3 being the highest rank.

Display Poster

Logbook / Journal

Presentation

Project Report File

Prototype / Build model of project (if applicable)

Research Plan

Display Board for Project's Poster

A poster is a summary of the project report file in a display format. All written details on the poster must be easy to read at a distance, we suggest using the Calibri (Body) font with your font size at 22. Students are free to choose any colors combinations. The display poster dimension is 76 cm height and 150 cm width.

The following titles must be written on the poster: Research question, Aim, Hypothesis, Engineering goal, Background research, Methods/ procedures, Errors and limitation gaps, Future research, Conclusion, Results, Data graph /table and Acknowledgements.



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
